

Early 19th-Century Cut Glass Water Jug, Circa 1830

Description

An elegant early 19th-century cut glass water jug, dating to circa 1830. Beautifully proportioned and finely cut, it has a gently swelling body rising to a distinctive flower-petal rim, which lends the piece a delicate, sculptural finish.

The clear glass is decorated with crisp hand-cut detailing that catches and refracts the light beautifully, giving the jug a lively brilliance whether displayed on a table or cabinet. Its refined form balances practicality with ornament: substantial enough for use, yet graceful enough to form a centrepiece within a formal table setting.

The petal-shaped rim is a particularly charming detail, recalling the taste for naturalistic motifs and elegant table glass during the first half of the 19th century. The combination of decorative cutting and carefully shaped lip gives the jug an appealing sense of craftsmanship and period character.

A handsome and versatile example of Georgian-period glass, ideal for serving water, wine, or summer drinks, and equally attractive as a decorative object. It would make a fine addition to a collection of antique glass or bring a note of 19th-century refinement to a dining table, sideboard, or display cabinet.
