Description

A fine and elegant pair of Edwardian 18ct yellow gold cufflinks, dating to circa 1910 and beautifully combining diamonds, mother-of-pearl, and enamel. Rich in period character, they offer a refined balance of precious materials and restrained early 20th-century design.

Each cufflink is fashioned in warm 18ct yellow gold and centred with luminous mother-of-pearl, whose natural iridescence creates a subtle play of colour in changing light. Delicate enamel detailing frames and enhances the composition, while diamond accents provide a discreet, sparkling finish. The contrast between the silky sheen of the mother-of-pearl, the lustre of gold, and the crisp brilliance of the diamonds gives the pair a particularly sophisticated appearance.

Dating from the Edwardian period, the cufflinks reflect the era's preference for elegance, fine workmanship, and carefully judged decoration. Their formal yet understated design makes them exceptionally versatile: polished enough for black-tie occasions, yet sufficiently restrained for a well-considered everyday wardrobe.

A handsome addition to a collection of antique gentlemen's jewellery, Edwardian accessories, or fine gold cufflinks. They would also make an exceptional gift, bringing together lasting materials, practical function, and more than a century of craftsmanship.
