

Victorian Silver-Plate Tiffin Dish, Circa 1860

Description

A fine Victorian silver-plate oval tiffin dish and stand, dating to circa 1860. Elegantly proportioned and designed for formal dining, this handsome serving piece embodies the practicality and polished grandeur of the mid-19th-century table.

The lidded oval dish sits within a fitted stand and is accompanied by a spirit burner beneath, allowing food to be kept warm during service. Such pieces were an important feature of well-appointed Victorian entertaining, enabling dishes to be presented at the table while maintaining their temperature throughout a meal. The oval form gives the piece a graceful profile, while the reflective silver-plated finish brings a refined brightness to the table.

The combination of a substantial serving dish, integral stand, and spirit burner makes this a particularly versatile object: equally suited to use as a chafing dish for vegetables, sauces, or prepared dishes, it also has considerable decorative appeal when displayed on a dining table or sideboard.

A charming and useful example of Victorian silver plate, offering both period character and enduring functionality. It would make a handsome addition to a collection of antique dining wares or a stylish centrepiece for traditional entertaining.
