A stylish brass wine decanting cradle dating from circa 1950, designed to present and pour a fine bottle with both elegance and care. Its gently curved frame supports the bottle securely at an angle, allowing wine to be decanted smoothly while helping to leave natural sediment undisturbed-particularly valuable when serving mature Bordeaux, vintage Port, or other cellar-aged wines.

Practical yet wonderfully theatrical, the cradle turns the act of opening a special bottle into a proper occasion. The warm brass finish brings a handsome mid-century character, while the simple, purposeful design reflects the enduring traditions of formal wine service. Whether used for a long-awaited bottle of Pétrus, a cherished vintage from the cellar, or simply to add ceremony to dinner, it offers both utility and style.

When not in use, this attractive piece makes a decorative addition to a sideboard, drinks trolley, home bar, dining room, wine cellar, or country-house kitchen. A thoughtful and distinctive gift for a serious wine collector, passionate host, or anyone who appreciates the rituals surrounding fine wine.
