A rare and ingenious late Victorian combination of folding fan and opera glasses by Asprey & Co., London, dating to circa 1880. Created for the opera, theatre, and formal evening entertainments, this exceptional accessory unites two essential elements of fashionable Victorian dress in a single, beautifully made object.

The folding fan is decorated with shimmering spangles that catch the light as it moves, while its elegant tortoiseshell and gilt-metal frame incorporates a pair of opera glasses. This inventive dual-purpose design allowed its owner to observe the performance at close range while retaining the theatrical elegance of a decorative fan. It is a wonderfully evocative object from an era in which personal accessories were chosen not simply for utility, but as expressions of refinement, fashion, and social standing.

Pieces of this kind would have been used in private boxes, concert halls, and society gatherings, where the rituals of the evening were as important as the performance itself. The clever integration of magnification and fan reflects the Victorian appetite for novelty, technical ingenuity, and luxurious detail.
