Description

An elegant Edwardian oak fitted stationery box, dating to circa 1910. Compact, practical, and beautifully conceived, it is a fine example of the kind of well-made desk accessory produced for the organised home or gentleman's study in the early 20th century.

The warm oak exterior has a pleasing grain and restrained, timeless appearance, while the interior is lined and fitted in leather. Designed to hold the essentials of correspondence, the box provides a smart and orderly place for writing paper, envelopes, stamps, pens, and other desk requisites. Its carefully arranged compartments reflect a period when letter writing was both a daily necessity and an important social ritual.

The combination of richly toned timber and leather gives the piece a quietly luxurious character. It would have sat comfortably on a desk, library table, or dressing-room chest, where its usefulness was matched by its decorative presence. Today, it remains a handsome and versatile object: equally suited to use as a traditional stationery box, a keepsake box, or an elegant desk-top storage piece.
