Each box is finished to evoke a richly bound book, with leather-covered surfaces and gilt decoration to the spine and edges. Their convincing book-form design gives them a warm, scholarly presence, while the hinged construction reveals a discreet compartment within. Faux book boxes have long been appreciated for their blend of utility and visual charm. During the mid-20th century, they became popular as decorative accessories for interiors that favoured traditional craftsmanship, collected objects, and the atmosphere of an established home.
